Language Laboratory Coming

We will soon have a facility that few other schools in West Bengal have, if any. Only this week the Chairman of the Pailan Group Mr Apurba Saha approved that the school purchase a language laboratory. This important learning facility is used for many purposes.

At our school, the first and most important use will be to assist our students to become highly proficient in English. Using a high quality international

program, the students will be guided through all aspects of English, including pronunciation, correct usage, grammar, comprehension and listening skills.

In using the equipment, students sit in rows facing the teacher and the display screen. Each student has a headphone and is able to follow the lesson easily. Students also have a microphone through which they are able to talk to the teacher or the whole class. Sitting in front of a console, the teachers can track each students' progress and can communicate to individuals or the whole class at once.

Once we have established the English language classes, the next step will be to use the laboratory for other languages such as French, Bengali or Hindi. With this wonderful facility we can expect that the quality of English used by our students will reach a much higher standard. Our international students will especially benefit.
